About this course

This course is a basic introduction to the topic of HTML and web design for those with little or no prior experience. It is recommended as the best place to begin if you're new to the topic and is ideal for those needing to create or update sites as part of their duties or for those who wish to create a site for an enterprise or organisation.

The course begins with a solid discussion of how the web works and how HTML and related technologies such as CSS and Flash fit together in the context of a site. We will then discuss the principals and practice of mark-up languages with reference to SGML and XML before moving on to a thorough explanation of the syntax and structure of HTML.

While the emphasis will be on using Dreamweaver as a creative application, continual reference will be made to the principals of good site design and efficient HTML and CSS coding. The course will include time on image preparation using Photoshop or Fireworks.
